<p>Know about the English artist Banksy and recognise some of his works.</p> <p>Know that Banksy's art work uses dark humour to challenge social etiquette and make political statements.</p> <p>Understand the importance of composition and the way that different elements are combined in a piece of artwork.</p> <p>Know that Banksy displays his art on publicly visible surfaces such as walls and self-built physical prop pieces.</p> <p>Take inspiration from the art work of Banksy to create their own art work.</p> <p>Make links between the designs of Banksy and their own work.</p>	<p>On-going throughout unit of work:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Systematically investigate, research and test ideas and plan using a sketchbook e.g. show how work will be produced and how the qualities of materials will be used. • Discuss the main theme of the artwork. • Explain what an artist is trying to say about their subject matter. • Discuss and review own and others work, expressing thoughts and feelings explaining their views and identify/ explain modifications or changes and see how they can be developed further <p>Lesson Specific:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use of scale, proportion and perspective more accurately when drawing. • Drawings show an understanding of the effect of light on objects and people from different directions. • Combining prints and overlay colours. • See positive and negative shapes (positive shapes occupy positive space - the area around positive shapes, the background, is negative space). • Start to overlay prints with mixed media and use tonal contrast. 	<p>Banksy graffiti legally considered vandalism stencilling visual art anti-capitalist anti-establishment anti-war controversial political prominent landmark public statement satire gritty humorous images secretive social subversive uncomfortable witty</p>
