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| <p>Know about the French artist Pablo Picasso and recognise some of his works which were categorised into periods by historians.</p> <p>Know that Picasso was regarded as one of the most influential artists in the 20th Century as he pushed against boundaries by experimented with different theories, techniques and ideas.</p> <p>Understand the impact of colour and the way that different elements can be combined in a piece of artwork.</p> <p>Take inspiration from the art work of Pablo Picasso to create their own art work.</p> <p>Make links between the work of Pablo Picasso and their own.</p> | <p>On-going throughout unit of work:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use a sketchbook for a variety of purposes including: recording observations; developing ideas; testing materials; planning and recording information. • Take the time to reflect upon what they like and dislike about own work and suggest how to improve it. • Describe the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines and make links to own work. <p>Lesson specific:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop drawing faces are in proportion with increased accuracy. • Use line, tone, pattern, colour, texture, shape and mark with care to represent things seen, imagined or remembered. • Begin to draw in scale applying rules of simple perspective. • Experiment with monochromatic paint scales using the terms tint (adding white), shade (adding black) and tone (adding black and white). • Show an understanding of complementary colours. • Consider the composition in collage work. • Think of a title for their final artwork and explain why that title is a good idea. | <p>contrast expressive vivid war time angles balance experimental geometric shapes avant-garde blue period classicism contour line cubism doodles muted colours primitivism profile rose period surrealism</p> |
