<p>Know about the Dutch painter Piet Mondrain and recognise some of his works</p> <p>Recognise that Piet Mondrian was a leader in the development of modern abstract art</p> <p>Know that abstract art is art that is not an accurate depiction of reality but instead uses shape, colour, form and marks</p> <p>Take inspiration from the art work of Piet Mondrian to create their own</p> <p>Make links between the designs of Piet Mondrian and their own work</p>	<p>On-going throughout unit of work:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Begin to use a sketchbook to record what they see and collect and record new processes and techniques. • Talk about the colours in the artwork. • Express clear preferences and give reasons for these e.g. I like that because.... • Reflect on the success of own work and identify changes they might make to develop it further. <p>Lesson specific:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Draw carefully in line from observation, recording shapes, positioning marks and features. • Explore tone using different grades of pencil, pastel and chalk. • Experiment and investigate with a variety of drawing tools. • Recognise, name and experiment with primary colours. • Experiment with a variety of different brush sizes and with other painting tools, such as sponge brushes and objects. • Manipulate materials e.g. by arranging, folding, repeating or overlapping. • Create own collage using a selection of different materials. 	<p>abstract</p> <p>collage</p> <p>composition</p> <p>horizontal</p> <p>overlapping</p> <p>overlying</p> <p>primary colours: red, yellow, blue</p> <p>secondary colours: orange, green, purple</p> <p>geometric</p> <p>irregular</p> <p>rectangles</p> <p>regular</p> <p>squares</p> <p>vertical</p> <p>influenced</p> <p>lines</p> <p>manipulate</p> <p>mixing</p> <p>realistic scene</p>
