| <p>Know about the Ukrainian born orphism/modern artist Sonia Delaunay and recognise some of her work.</p> <p>Know that Sonia Delaunay’s exploration of colour and form were important in the development of abstract art.</p> <p>Understand that she was a pioneering female artist who applied orphism principles to everyday life, including textiles, wallpaper, furniture, clothing, stage sets and interior design.</p> <p>Take inspiration from the art work of Sonia Delaunay to create their own art work.</p> <p>Make links between the work of Sonia Delaunay and their own.</p> | <p>On-going throughout unit of work:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Begin to use a sketchbook to record what they see and collect and record new processes and techniques. • Express clear preferences and give reasons for these e.g. <i>I like that because...</i> • Talk about the colours in the artwork. • Reflect on the success of own pieces of art identifying what went well and what could be better next time. <p>Lesson specific:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Experiment with different drawing techniques e.g. hatching, stippling, blending, shading and erasing. • Investigate mixing a wider variety colour, to create different tones (adding white and black to a colour) • Manipulate materials e.g. by arranging, folding, repeating or overlapping. • Use various collage materials to make a specific image. • Create own collage using a selection of different materials. | <p>abstract patterns avant-garde composition contrasting colours cubism hue interior design Modern Art Orphism Sonia Delaunay geometric geometric shapes pioneering regular mathematical shapes textiles designs experimental overlapping shade vibrant</p> |
