



# Remote Learning



## **INTRODUCTION**

We are all really aware of the amount of time our children have missed this year due to the coronavirus and I know we all want to do everything we can to not lose anymore learning time than is necessary. This is why our schools remain open and why we have a range of measures in place to keep us all safe. Unfortunately, sometimes, we are still unable to prevent coronavirus from affecting people in our school community. When this happens and a group of children have to go home, we do not want their learning journey to stop. Below is a summary of what a school day at home will look like when we ask a bubble of children to stay at home and isolate.

## **WHAT THE SCHOOL DAY LOOKS LIKE AT HOME**

- 9.15am Morning Zoom Call – register, worship, explanation of the day's learning
- 9.30-3.00 Home Learning on Purple Mash, supported by parents, with feedback from teachers
  - Daily Reading (20 minutes)
  - Daily Maths (20 minutes)
  - Daily Phonics and Spelling (KS1) or Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (KS2) (20 minutes)
  - Topic activity (20 minutes)
- 3.00pm Afternoon Zoom Call – register, review of the day, story time

## **HELP WE NEED FROM THE GROWN-UPS AT HOME**

- Sign in to the daily Zoom sessions with the class teacher at 9:15am and 3:00pm daily (a link will be sent at the start of the week)
- Ask for help from the school by emailing the office or making contact directly with the teacher through the parent portal of Purple Mash using 2email
- Monitor your child/children to ensure they're using the internet in a safe and respectable manner
- If a child is unable to access remote learning, parents should contact school as soon as possible - this will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis
- Talk through the Zoom rules for children so they know how to behave in an online classroom
- Make the school aware if your child is sick or otherwise can't complete work

### ***DID YOU KNOW....***

1. Class teachers have responsibility for daily contact with every child in their class – through Zoom and Purple Mash
2. Class teachers are available every day from 9.00am to 3.30pm to assist you at any point.
3. Mr Wilson can answer any questions you have about accessing PurpleMash – let your teaching know what help you need.

3. Keep your microphone muted until you are ready to speak to allow others to hear.
4. Raise your hand and wait to be called on before un-muting yourself. One person speaks at a time, just like in the classroom!
5. Always enable your video during the meeting, no profile pictures.
6. No virtual backgrounds.
7. Always be polite and respectful to everyone. Treat others online like you wish to be treated in person.
8. Do not take photographs or recordings of the Zoom meetings.
9. Only use the chat function if you have been told to do so by your teacher, always be respectful when using the chat.
10. Remember you should continue to follow the school rules.
